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Competition Information and Rules

THE PROPRIOTER WOULD ASK THAT **DOGS ARE NOT BROUGHT** TO THE EVENT

How will the competition be judged?

- Each competitor will be required to jump one round. The course will consist of working hunter fences, followed by portable/solid cross country fences and will finish with show jumps. Competitors will be asked to jump a maximum of 20 fences.
- The show jumping phase of the course will be **timed**.
- **Rider and horse/pony must ride the working hunter and cross country phases in a controlled, steady manner as these phases are not timed. Disqualification will result if a rider is deemed to ride these phases inappropriately.**
- Times from the show jumping phase will be used for placings in the event of two or more teams/individuals being on equal scores.
- The competitor/team with the least amount of faults and the quickest time/s will be the winner.
- Competitors must go between the finish posts/flags to qualify a time.
- Eliminated riders will not be permitted to continue jumping and will be asked to leave the arena upon elimination.

CLASS 1 - INDIVIDUAL PRIMARY

- This is for individual competitors who are not part of a school team.
- This class is open to **PRIMARY SCHOOL** pupils only.
- Primary School competitors can compete in any of the classes except Class 2.
- The same rider/animal combination cannot compete more than once.



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CLASS 2 - INDIVIDUAL NEWCOMER

- This class is for Key Stage 3 pupils only and aimed at riders representing their School for the first time.
- Competitors taking part in this class cannot take part in any other class.
- Entries for this class are limited to a maximum of 20 riders. If this class is over-subscribed a waiting list will be employed.
- Entries will be taken on a first come, first served place with full payment.

CLASSES 3 AND 4 - NOVICE (CLASS 3) AND OPEN (CLASS 4)

- Classes are open to anyone aged 19 or under and in full time education.
- All competitors in these classes are eligible for individual prizes.
- Each team must consist of at least 2 riders with a minimum of 3 different combinations of rider/pony.
- The 3 lowest scores and times, of each team, will count.
- Post-primary School competitors can enter both the Novice and Open classes but the same rider/animal combination cannot compete more than once ie. A rider can compete in both the novice and the open class but this must be on a different animal.
- Team members should be entered in the order they wish to compete.
- Competitors will jump in their teams, one after the other.
- The **same team cannot compete** in both the Novice and Open team competition.
- Schools may join together to form a mixed team. Only teams with all members from the same school can qualify for first place in the Open and Novice classes. Subsequent places are open to all teams.
- A horse or pony may be ridden by two riders, from the same School, in one class only if it is fit to do so. A horse/pony can compete no more than twice.

TEAM SELECTORS SHOULD MAKE SURE THAT COMPETITORS ARE COMPETENT RIDERS

GENERAL RULES

- All riders **must** wear regulation safety hats and body protectors. Safety hats must meet one of the following standards: **AS/NZS 3838: 1998 or 2003, ASTM F1163: 1998, EN1384: 1996 or BSEN 1384: 1997, EN 14572, PAS 015:1994, PAS015 1998, Snell E2001**
- Body protectors must meet **BETA 2009 Level 3** standard whilst hats must be These must be brought to the tack inspection. 'Hoodies' are not permitted whilst on horseback.
- Spurs may only be worn in Class 4 and must comply with Pony Club rules.
- General rules, for this event, will be under those followed by the Pony Club.
- All competitors must report to the 'tack inspector' at their stated time. The tack inspector will check the safety of tack and will judge the 'turnout' at the same time. If tack is deemed to be unsafe, competitors must make the necessary amendments and re-present themselves to the tack inspector. If a competitor fails to present themselves to the tack inspector, or is unable to amend any unsafe tack, they will not be allowed to compete.
- A responsible adult must be appointed by the School to act as Chef d'equipe and be present with the team/individual on arrival and during the competition. The Chef d'equipe is responsible for the conduct of his/her team/individual at all times.
- **JUDGES AND STEWARDS DECISIONS ARE FINAL.**
- Any queries regarding results must be made within 30 minutes of completion of the class.
- Any rider or school representative showing unsporting behaviour will automatically be disqualified.
- Late entries may be taken at the discretion of the organisers.
- The organisers wish to remind competitors and spectators that equestrian activities can be dangerous.

TOP FUNDRAISER

This event is a fundraiser for Macmillan Cancer Support in memory of long-time supporters John and Gwyneth Wilkinson. A Botanica hamper will be awarded for the top fundraiser on the day. The winner of this prize will be announced before the start of the Open competition.
