I am writing to advise pupils who wish to be considered for AS English Literature study in late August 2020, about some important preparatory reading.

It is a requirement that each pupil should complete their reading of *Frankenstein* by Mary Shelley during the holiday. Pupils have already begun work on this on Google Classroom, but should complete their initial reading of the novel prior to the start of the course in the new school year.

Pupils should also read and familiarise themselves with the plot and central themes of the play *A Streetcar Named Desire* by Tennessee Williams, and the CCEA Robert Frost and Seamus Heaney poetry anthology, which is available on Google Classroom.

Texts can be made available from reception on request, though we would highly encourage pupils to purchase their own copies for making notes, and annotations, if they are able. Purchasing their own copies of the texts would also benefit pupils in light of the logistical issues with regards to access to shared/borrowed books that would be presented by the possibility of a blended home and school learning approach in the new term, and in light of the hygiene concerns which would arise as a result.
