Assessment and End of Year Arrangements for Yr12

End of Year Information

Following the assessment weeks, pupils in Year 12 will attend normal classes Monday 10th May - Wednesday 12th May. 12th May will be their final full timetabled day.

Staff who need to complete GCSE courses, especially for those pupils continuing to AS level, will inform pupils of the need to attend class and arrange sessions according to the year 12 timetable. These sessions may be delivered in school or remotely via Google Classroom, whichever the teacher selects.

Year 12 pupils will attend an "introduction to AS" week beginning 1st June. Timetable to follow.

Assessment Information

These assessments are very important in helping teachers to have enough information to produce Centre Determined Grades. Please attend as you would have done for actual GCSEs, had you been sitting them. I wish you well in them.

Session start times are 9:00am, 11:45am, 1:30pm.

You can enter the hall from either corridor.

You do not need to 'sign in' on Google Classroom during the assessment weeks.

Form Rooms can be used for lunch and break if you need to stay in school over these times for a further exam. If the weather is fine please use the outside areas to get some fresh air.

Those who gave their names as requiring to stay in school between sessions 1 and 3, because they can't get home between exams, may go to L30 to study.

Normal School examination rules apply, remember you can use your lockers to store things that can't be brought into the hall. School uniform is to be worn.

- 1. Be on time for all your assessments. If you are late, your work might not be accepted.
- 2. Do not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice during the assessment.
- 3. If you try to cheat, or break the rules in any way, you could be disqualified from that assessment.
- 4. You must not take into the assessment room:
 - (a) notes;
 - (b) potential technological/web enabled sources of information such as an iPod, a **mobile phone**, a MP3/4 player or similar device, a smartwatch or a wrist watch which has a data storage device.

Any pencil cases taken into the assessment room must be see-through. Remember: possession of unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.

- 5. If you wear a wrist watch the invigilator will ask you to remove it and place it on your desk.
- 6. Do not use correcting pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers.
- 7. Do not talk to or try to communicate with, or disturb other candidates once the assessment has started.

- You must not write inappropriate, obscene or offensive material.
 Do not borrow anything from another candidate during the assessment.
