




Drop off

- Main gates will be closed but will be manned from 10.00am – 11.10am






You must enter and exit using the Valentine Road pedestrian gates



Important reminders for assessment day






In the case of a fire alarm

- Stay seated
- Remain calm
- Listen to the instructions given







Silence is required



Check you can see a clock



Remember you will have 70 minutes



Listen carefully to the statement the invigilator will read (on the next slides)

The 1st statement that will be read aloud

PLEASE LISTEN CAREFULLY

The assessment will last for 1 Hour 10 minutes; it will start at 10.00am and will finish at 11.10am.

I shall let you know when 20 minutes have passed, when 40 minutes have passed and when 60 minutes have passed.

When I tell you to begin, you should answer the questions as quickly and as carefully as you can.

All answers should be written in pencil on the assessment paper.

You should begin at the beginning and continue right through.

If you come to a question that you are not able to answer, leave it and go on to the next question; you may return to this question later.

You may do any rough working on the separate sheet or at the side of your assessment paper.

When you are writing out your answer on the assessment paper, do so in your normal writing, making it as neat as possible.

You must not give any help to another pupil and you must not copy from another pupil.

Make sure that you do not turn over two pages at once.

If you are making any changes to your answers, try to do so as neatly as possible.

If you wish to attract my attention, you should raise your hand.

The 2nd statement that will be read aloud, just before you start.

There are X pages in the assessment paper and when I say "turn over", you should turn to page 1 and start to answer the questions.

Whenever you complete a page, go on to the next one without waiting to be told. If you are finished early you will **not** be able to leave before the other pupils; you should look over your work and make sure that you have not missed any pages You should work as carefully as you can.

I am not able to answer any questions or give you any help during the test. If you think that there is a mistake on the paper, if the print is not clear or if there may be a page missing, you should raise your hand and I shall come to you.

You must not talk during the assessment.


You may turn the page over and start. I wish you all the best".

Please put any extra sheets into your assessment booklet and close the booklet.


Please continue to sit quietly until all the assessment papers are collected.


When leaving please take EVERYTHING with you
