School Gateway

As you are aware, there have been some changes to the way we share information with parents this year and process payments. This has had to be done because SIMS Pay360 is no longer offering its service. We are replacing both with School Gateway which will allow you to access your emails from the school, school report, your child's timetable, add money onto their canteen account and pay for any other trips, all in one place. Not all of these features have been available up to now but when you next sign into the School Gateway app or website, you will find that they are now present. The school will use the Gateway app to notify you should your daughter/child be absent from school with the function to send a reply stating the reason for this absence thus replacing the need for you to send in an explanatory note to the Form Teacher.

We are hoping that by moving to School Gateway that this will make it easier for you to keep on top of your child's progress in school. We encourage you to download the School Gateway app if you haven't already done so, as it will help us to more easily share information about your child. SIMSparent and Pay360 should then be deleted.
