NI Curriculum Review

In October 2024, the Education Minister commissioned Lucy Crehan, an international expert in education policy, to carry out a review of the Northern Ireland Curriculum. Lucy visited Glenlola this week to observe lessons and discuss the curriculum and its impact with staff and pupils.

GCSE and A level trip to Stormont

On Monday 20th January, Year 12 and 13 Government and Politics pupils visited Parliament Buildings, Stormont. Anne Marie, one of the fantastic Education Officers from the NI Assembly Education Service met our group and took us to a committee room where she explained the background to the NI assembly, the most recent election, and the current parties in power.

Following this four MLAs from different parties came to speak to our group: Phillip McGuigan [Sinn Fein], Alan Chambers [UUP], Connie Egan [Alliance] and Peter Martin [DUP]. Each MLA gave a brief background to their political position and then the floor was opened for pupils to ask each MLA questions. There was a wide range of issues raised; the potential for a referendum on an 'All Ireland,' the potential for amalgamating the UUP and DUP to create one NI Unionist party and the progression of legislation on violence against women and girls in Northern Ireland.

The final part of our visit was to sit in the Public Gallery and hear part of the plenary session in the Debating Chamber. Matthew O'Toole, leader of the Opposition [SDLP], spoke on the issue of Custodial Facilities, specifically the Protection of Rights and Safety of Prisoners, a lively exchange of views was heard. It was fascinating to see the Assembly working in practice and a thoroughly informative and enjoyable trip for everyone.
