Dear Yr12 Parent/Guardian

As ever, our pupils have impressed me with their dedication in getting to this point of approaching the end of their GCSE courses. Time moves on and I want to inform you that the last Year 12 timetabled school day will be on Friday 2 May which will be a half day finishing at noon. Pupils have received detailed regulations regarding the examinations via email and their Year 12 Google Classroom. I should like to draw your attention to the following important points:

Study leave arrangements – Year 12 pupils are not required to attend School when they do not have an examination, and may leave School between a morning and afternoon exam. The arrangement for study leave is a privilege which may be withdrawn by the Section Head. The Yr13 Study Room will be available for private study.

Check the dates and times of exams very carefully and keep on checking during the period of the exams. Arrive 15 minutes before the session begins. Morning sessions start at 9.15 am, afternoon sessions begin at 1.30 pm.

If ill on the morning of an exam, please contact the School as soon as possible. A Medical Certificate will be required. Please inform me if anything arises, or has arisen, which may require a special consideration application to be made on behalf of your child.

Results will be available for collection from School on Thursday 21 August between 9.00 am and 10.30 am in the library. Complete and return the form about future plans which is included with the results. It is great to see so many of our pupils return to Senior School in Glenlola Collegiate. Along with the good attendance requirement, pupils must gain 12 or more GCSE points including at least a grade C in English Language and Mathematics. The scoring system is that a grade $A^* = 4$ points, A = 3, A = 2, A = 1.5 and A =

Please note also that although Friday 2 May marks an end to the full timetable for Year 12 pupils, it is possible that some of your daughter's teachers will continue to use the timetabled periods for their subject in order to finalise preparations for examinations and deliver revision classes. If this happens for any of your daughter's subjects, they should view them as normal lessons, and will be expected to attend. Pupils coming into School whether for examinations, to attend revision sessions or if they are coming in to speak to a member of staff, should ensure they wear full school uniform. Normal uniform rules apply throughout the examination period.


